■ A new show opens Friday, August 26, at **The Walker's Point Center for the Arts**, 438 W. National, with a reception beginning at 6 PM. Arizonan **Robert Wick** created an installation "Bronze Landscape and Life," sculptural pieces ranging from thirty inches to fifteen feet in height. Wick has shown extensively during his career and has received many honors and commissions, being very much in demand for his treatment in modulating metal. He sculpts in bronze, giving grand consideration to shape and texture.

Composer **Sigmund Snopek** collaborated with Wick in producing a sound piece utilizing the sounds of the bronze foundry, sampling them on today's technologically advanced synthesizers and pouring them into forms for a public performance. The one time sound performance piece is at 8 PM. Snopek is accompanied by the **Sylvan Winds Quintet**, juxtaposing a quasi-industrial sentiment with conventional instrumentation. This one should not be missed. The visual portion of the piece may be seen through September 23.
